Their job is to listen carefully to the children about any worries they have. This may include worries about friendships, other children, adults, incidents within school or incidents out of school. DSLs are responsible for listening carefully and working with the children and their parents to help resolve issues.

This is Mrs. Hildred. She is our Site Manager.



Her job is to ensure that the site is safe and secure. Every morning, she checks inside and

outside of the buildings for anything that may be a risk to the children. She is responsible for fixing and removing anything dangerous. Mrs. Hildred, also locks the gates after all of the children have arrived so our site is safe and secure whilst the children are in school.
